### *Welcome to Our Church House*



With the celebration of giving "thanks" still fresh on our minds, Our Sunday Visitor's pamphlet *How to Celebrate Advent* reminds us that over the next several weeks we have the opportunity to celebrate occasions that are often times overlooked. The Advent Wreath (origins 16th century Germany) symbolizes God's eternal love. The wreath holds four candles...three violet and one pink. The Advent calendar begins December 2 and there is a door for each day, behind which is hidden a picture or scripture verse. The Jesse Tree is a way of remembering the Jewish roots of the Messiah. The tree may be made of paper or a real branch and displaying signs and symbols of God's saving activity: a rainbow, stone tablets, a dove, an ark. During the season of Advent there are numerous saints whose lives were fully devoted to God that follow our faith. These men and women set a wonderful example for all to follow. In our Cathedral's gathering space we have a framed picture of the Virgin De Guadalupe. The story of St. Juan Diego is interesting in that on December 9, 1531, he was walking fifteen miles before dawn to Mass, where now is Mexico City, when he heard music and saw a glowing cloud encircled by a rainbow. A woman's voice called him to the top of Tepeyac Hill. The woman was dressed like an Aztec princess. She identified herself as the Virgin Mary and asked Juan Diego to tell the bishop to build a church on the site where she appeared. Her request: "I vividly desire that a church be built on this site, so that in it I can be present and give my love, compassion, help and defense, for I am your most devoted mother . . . to hear your laments and to remedy all your miseries, pains and sufferings". Having lived a simple life as a weaver, farmer and laborer he was doubted by the bishop. The bishop asked Juan to bring back proof of his vision. Before he could return with proof he learned that his father was dying and he went to find a priest, therefore missing his chance to meet with the Virgin. As he was bringing a priest to his father the Virgin appeared to him and informed him that his father had been cured. The Virgin told Juan to return to the hill where they met. When he arrived he was surprised to find the hill covered with flowers growing in frozen soil. He collected the flowers in his cloak and took them to the bishop. Juan recounted his story to the bishop and showed the flowers that he had collected. The flowers were Castilian roses, not grown in Mexico. What was even more amazing to the bishop was not the fact of the rare flowers but that Juan's cloak had the image of the Virgin. The bishop soon had the church built where the Virgin Mary appeared. Juan Diego died on May 30, 1548, at the age of 74 and was canonized on July 31, 2002, at the Basilica of Guadalupe, Mexico City, Mexico, by Pope John Paul II. Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas feast day in the United States.
