I recently was reminded that the month of October is designated the month of the rosary. Upon reading the article I began thinking just how much do Catholics know about the rosary? For the last several years the interest in individuals reciting the rosary has been on the decline. Pope John Paul II attributes the decline due to the lack on the part of parents to teach their children the importance of praying the rosary and that individuals may see the praying of the rosary as outdated anti-ecumenical or superstitious. The rosary was an important part of the Pope's life, as it was of great comfort reciting the rosary through moments of difficulty and joy in his life. When reciting the rosary the Pope suggest

that individuals can focus either on the events in the life of Christ, to picture the luminous mystery that corresponds with the decade that is being prayed or to focus on a picture that represents the decade. When we pray the rosary we can either pray silently alone or with a group of people and we must remember, says Pope John Paul II, to pause and reflect on the mystery of the decade. If the rosary is prayed everyday the schedule is: Joyful Mysteries (events from the early life of Christ) Monday and Saturday; Sorrowful Mysteries (the sufferings He endured at the end of His life) Tuesday and Friday; and Glorious Mysteries (the heavenly glory of the Lord and His mother) Wednesday and Sunday. In October 2002, Pope John Paul II announced the new Luminous Mysteries in his apostolic letter Rosarium Virginis Mariae (On the Most Holy Rosary). He suggested the five new mysteries as: Christ's baptism in the Jordan; His self-manifestation at the wedding of Cana; His proclamation of the kingdom of God with His call to conversion; His Transfiguration and His institution of the Eucharist. The new Luminous Mysteries (significant events from the public ministry of Jesus as it is presented in the Gospel) will be recited on Thursdays. This month we invite families to say the rosary together and learn why the Pope says that the rosary "is and always has been a prayer of and for the family".
