"I will not allow myself to be so absorbed in the whirlwind of work as to forget about God. The following articles are taken from Crux of the News. Marriage survey results: Results of a nationwide survey found some Catholics unfamiliar with Church teachings about marriage. * Nearly ¾ very familiar or somewhat familiar with teaching. But many mistakenly believe that a non-Catholic spouse must promise to raise the couple's children as Catholic (60%) and that Church teaching accepts divorce in cases of marital infidelity (not true). * Marriage patterns among Catholics similar to all Americans, 53% Catholics married, 25% never married, 12% divorced, 5% widowed, 4% living with a partner and 1% separated. Of note: Including those remarried 23% of American Catholics have been divorced at some time. * Among those currently married, nearly a third (30%) had not been married in the Church or had their marriage "convalidated". For those who were separated or divorced at the time of the survey more than half (51%) said they had not been married in the Church or had their marriage convalidated. * Of those divorced, 85% had not sought an annulment; 8% had asked for an annulment but it was not granted; annulment granted to only 7% of divorced. April 2007 survey, by Bishop Committee on Marriage and Family Life on Catholic attitudes and practices; by the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) at Georgetown University via the internet polling firm Knowledge Networks. Margin of error 3.1%.

On May 13, 1917, when Sister Lucia was 10 years old, she and her cousins, Francisco, 9, and Jacinta, 7, claimed to have seen Mary at Fatima near their home. The apparitions continued once a month until October 1917 and later were declared worthy of belief by the Catholic Church. Recently Pope Benedict lifted a five-year waiting period to start the canonization process for Carmelite Sister Lucia dos Santos, one of the three children who saw Our Lady of Fatima in 1917. Cardinal Jose Saraiva Martins, head of the Vatican Congregation for Saints' Causes, made the announcement at the February 13 Mass in Coimbra commemorating the third anniversary for Sister Lucia's death. In 2000 Pope John Paul II Beatified Lucia's cousins, who died as children.
